**Citizen Corps.** Citizen Corps, a vital component of USA Freedom Corps, was created to help coordinate volunteer activities that will make our communities safer, stronger, and better prepared to respond to any emergency situation.

**East African Center.** The East African Center is a non-profit organization committed to assisting communities achieve empowerment through adult and child literacy programs, health education and poverty eradication programs.

**Junior Chamber Family AIDS Network.**

Mobilizing communities for effective solutions that support and enhance the lives of children and families living with HIV/AIDS is the mission of this project. This is lived out through a national network of local service providers.

**Governmental Involvement.** The organization has a long history of impacting the nation through projects specifically directed at action and involvement with local, state, and national government agencies. Most notable in this area is the Get Out the Vote campaign that was started in 1923.

The **Jaycee Debate** competition determines the most outstanding debate team in the organization for that year. The first place Debate winners at the Year-End Meeting may represent the organization at the World Debating Competition. This competition is held during the JCI World Congress.

**Jaycee Jeopardy** is a question-and-answer contest dealing mainly with the history of the Junior Chamber organization, its officers, goals, and activities. Sources of information may include *The Jaycee Book*, *Jaycees Magazine*, *A Legacy of Leadership* (the 75th anniversary history book), Annual Meeting, National Programs, and TOYA. Finalists are selected from all contestants and from the finalist round, up to five winners will be selected.

The **Master's Speak-Up** competition provides eligible state officers and local chapter presidents the opportunity to compete while in office. The format and judging procedure for this competition is the same as for the Speak-Up competition. The first-place winner must deliver his or her speech at the general assembly meeting following the announcement of winners.

The **Jaycee Idol** competition is held at the Annual Meeting and provides Jaycees the opportunity to showcase their singing abilities. Its format is similar to talent competitions on national television.

## A Brief History of the Organization

Established in 1920 to provide opportunities for young men to develop personal and leadership skills through service to others, the Jaycees later expanded to include women, reflecting the growing influence and leadership of women in America.

For the past 83 years, Jaycees have been a force for good in America and around the world. Jaycees helped establish AirMail services in America with Jaycee Charles Lindbergh, and have raised millions of dollars for causes such as the Muscular Dystrophy Association and the March of Dimes. They have built parks, playgrounds, hospitals, ball fields, and housing

for the elderly while conducting service and support programs in thousands of communities nationwide.

Jaycees can be found in all walks of life: governmental leaders such as past Presidents Bill Clinton and Gerald Ford, business tycoons such as Domino's Pizza mogul Tom Monaghan, registered nurse and former Miss America Kaye Lani Rae Rafko-Wilson, sports heroes like basketball great Larry Bird – name the field and Jaycees can be found at the forefront.

With the focus of the nation on volunteerism, from the smallest towns to the largest cities, the Jaycees are enlarging areas of opportunity for young people.

## Nationwide Chapter Projects

Our organization focuses on building young men and women into effective leaders in communities across the nation. To develop these leadership skills chapters help people through community action projects. Although each chapter has signature projects that address specific needs in their community, there are several projects that the organization conducts annually on a nationwide basis. **Jaycees Against Youth Smoking (JAYS).** This is a free, educational program that goes directly into elementary and middle school classrooms to teach children about the dangers of smoking and to help them make the informed decision to be smoke free.

**Outstanding Young Farmer Awards.** This project has been established to foster better urban-rural relations by creating a greater interest in, and understanding of, today's farmers and their problems by honoring their achievements. It is sponsored by John Deere and supported by the National Association of County Agricultural Agents and the Outstanding Farmers of America Fraternity.

**Ten Outstanding Young Americans.** This awards program exists to recognize and honor ten Americans each year who exemplify the best attributes of the nation's young people, aged 21 through 39. Winners are selected on their achievement or contribution in at least three categories ranging from community service to business, from entertainment to personal accomplishment.

## Special Programs to Help You Quickly Get Involved in Your Chapter

This is a program for members to follow to learn about the Junior Chamber and experience personal growth in a logical manner. Forms for the Springboard and Degrees programs are included in the forms section of [www.usjaycees.org](http://www.usjaycees.org).

**SPRINGBOARD**, designed for first-year members, is a tool for the chapter to activate new members, ensure that they have every opportunity to gain the benefits of membership, and are able to make a fully informed decision when it comes time to renew their membership.

**CERTIFICATION:** Upon completion of the Springboard requirements, including renewing dues, the new member should complete the Springboard Certification Form, ask the Chapter President to sign it, and mail it to the state office. This will certify the new member in the Springboard program. Once new members have completed the Springboard requirements, they will have earned their first three Degrees.



**DEGREES OF JAYCEES** continues where Springboard leaves off. Degrees of Jaycees is a career path for members, providing a logical sequence of events to be followed. By working through the various requirements spread across 10 degree levels, members will learn and grow in the Junior Chamber experience.

For the member, Degrees is a guide for personal growth. In addition, each member completing the Degrees of Jaycees program achieves the benefits of leadership training while directly affecting the experience of other members.

For the chapter, Degrees of Jaycees is a personnel management program which can be used toward the achievement of chapter goals through member participation. The chapter also gains increased visibility and influence within the community. The Degrees program is divided into three phases, as described below:

**Phase 1: INVOLVEMENT** — The first three degrees provide newer Jaycees with opportunities to experience orientation, training, community awareness, and sharing Jaycees. (see Springboard)

**Phase 2: EXPERIENCE** — Degrees four, five, and six are designed to let Jaycees use their experiences from the first phase to develop skills in activation, action, and recruiting.

**Phase 3: LEADERSHIP** — The last four degrees use the participants' training and leadership skills gained in the first two phases.

**CERTIFICATION:** When a degree has been achieved, members should complete a Degrees of Jaycees Certification Form, listing the degree and the activities completed. Chapter Presidents must sign the forms and send them to their state office. *Note: Participants must complete one degree at a time. There are no retroactive items. Only degrees completed during the current Junior Chamber year are accepted.*

## Personal Skills Tested During Special Competitions

The USJC Individual Competition Program is designed to help promote the skills of its members in the areas of speaking, writing, debating, and interviewing. These competitions help members become more confident in presenting themselves verbally and in written format; skills that can be transferred to a member's personal and professional life.

Each state selects its representative through statewide competition. There is only one representative per competition per state. Contestants must meet all eligibility requirements listed in the National Awards Manual which is available at [www.usjaycees.org](http://www.usjaycees.org).

### Resume/Interviewing Skills

**The C. William Brownfield Memorial Award** is presented annually to up to five outstanding first-year members.

**The John H. Armbruster "Keyman" Memorial Award** is presented annually to up to five outstanding members who have continued to show support, dedication, and enthusiasm following their first year of membership.

**The Andrew and Charlotte Mungenast Memorial Award** is presented annually to up to five outstanding families in The U.S. Junior Chamber. These are families who have promoted and exemplified the objectives and beliefs of the Jaycee Creed.

### Verbal/Writing Skills

**Speak-Up** competition is held to determine the most outstanding speakers in The U.S. Junior Chamber for that year. The first-place winner must deliver his or her winning prepared speech at the general assembly meeting following the announcement of winners.

**Write-Up** competition determines the most outstanding writers in The U.S. Junior Chamber for that year. The winning essay from the Year-End Meeting competition is published in the official publication of The U.S. Junior Chamber.
